## Hello from the Mountaineer Region-

We recently hosted Chris B and Boyd P at our spring convention to give their presentation on the history of the Basic Text. Many of us were deeply moved at what those addicts were able to achieve, especially considering the obstacles they overcame such as no funding and none of the modern technologies for communication, printing, copying, etc. It was truly incredible and inspiring. Addicts came together motivated by love of the fellowship and the desire to carry the message and created our foundational piece of literature. They changed the fellowship and the world for the better. We are wondering if we can use their example to help us with some of the challenges our fellowship faces today.

We wholeheartedly support NAWs efforts to move away from being dependent on literature sales to fund services. We are pleased to see that member donations have greatly increased, but we believe this method is only part of the solution. While progress has been made, it is difficult for us to see how member donations will increase sufficiently for this change to occur, and we believe it needs to happen. The Covid era shutdowns led us to examine how we do things here in our region just as they did all over the world. So how do we build a better NAWs that is not reliant on literature sales to meet its mission and better carry the message to the addict who still suffers?

We think it is important to set some goals. Specifically what is our time line? How many years to get there? Can we set a date realizing that it's a goal not a hard deadline? We think that's a good place to start. And what would our budget look like? So far even though donations have increased, we haven't seen any significant change in the budget. It appears to us that we are using the same old business model where we sell literature at a very substantial markup. We won't sugarcoat things here. We have genuine concerns that NAWs as it is currently configured is not making the best use of our financial resources. That is not to say we don't believe in or support NAWs. We do. We donated \$7500 to NAWs in our last fiscal year. We don't agree with the NAW\$ folks. We believe NAWs does important work and we believe in its mission. We believe the people that work there are good people doing good work. But we seriously question the business model as it currently stands. If we can't get there solely by increasing donations, we have to look at expenses. Some hard questions need to be asked.

Do we need to continue to maintain an office in Los Angeles? We hope you will not dismiss this question out of hand. LA (and California for that matter) is a very expensive place to do business. Yes that's where it's always been and yes it's close to the ports but plenty of businesses have moved to and/or thrived in less expensive locations. We realize that such a move would be very disruptive both to the office and the people that work there. We do not ask this question blindly but isn't it something we should at least consider? Gather some information? Furthermore in the age of the internet and electronic communications, do we need everyone to be at the office? And do we really need to employ as many people as we do? As our zones have matured, they have gotten much better at supporting their regions (we're even considering joining one again!). Couldn't the zones lighten the burden on NAWs? Maybe the regional service offices could handle smaller orders for literature, etc and NAWs could just do bulk shipments. Maybe we should bring back world level subcommittees. Our point is that NAWs doesn't have to do everything. And again we realize that downsizing can be painful but if done over time by attrition and retirements, it can be less so.

In all honesty our true reason for writing this letter is that we want to see a reduction in the price of our literature. AA sells their books a lot cheaper than we sell ours. Our groups and areas are having a hard time meeting their basic expenses, let alone having extra money to buy books. At the interim WSC this spring we passed a budget that states that we plan to have income of over \$8.7 million on literature sales while spending less than \$1.7 million on production of that literature. That markup is staggeringly high- more than four times the cost of production. It appears to us that NAWs could sell literature at half the price we do now and still make money. So what we really want is for NAWs to stop relying on literature sales and reduce the price of literature because we don't think we should be paying more than 4x the cost of production for books to fund an office in LA. Again we believe in the work NAWs does but we also believe it can be done at less cost. The addicts who wrote our basic text wrote it to save lives, not to pay for world services. If they could produce the miracle of the Basic Text with no funding from world, surely we can find a way to carry out world service without relying on literature sales. We have only to set our minds to it and believe that it can be
